

District Development Objectives

The Ballpark District Development Strategy leverages public lands and the public investment of the new ballpark to create a <u>new place in the city</u> – a vibrant, mixed-use destination on the Anacostia River.

Development Objectives:

- Create an exciting urban destination on the Anacostia River;
- Provide a unique and exceptional fan experience at the ballpark;
- 3. Promote public benefit, economic development and economic inclusion;
- 4. Achieve excellence in execution by aligning public and private stakeholders to support a common vision.





The development plan for the Waterfront Ballpark District defines a vision for the Nation's Pastime and the City's most valuable forgotten resource – the Anacostia River.

- Mixed Use 24/7 district
- Ballpark is an anchor but not the primary focus
- An animated waterfront should be the primary focus with First and Potomac as a great address
- First Street primary commercial corridor
- Retail is "the glue"





A density and diversity of uses where Half Street and First Street become new retail and entertainment destinations

- Retail and Entertainment Uses
- Residential
- Office
- Hotel





A significant active and programmable public open space at the water's edge at First Street & Potomac Avenue







A ballpark design that creates a great fan experience AND contributes to the vitality of the larger district

- A continuous retail edge along First Street with maximum retail leasing depths
- A publicly accessible open space at the north entrance to facilitate a dramatic entry sequence (regardless of orientation)
- The ballpark must have a civic identity on South capitol Street and towards the Anacostia River
